Response to Evaluation of the Communication Program at Sapir Academic College

1. Acceptance of more than 10% incoming students on probation	We reviewed the acceptance rates of students on probation as well as the admissions process. We observed that some candidates admitted on probation should have been accepted on regular terms and that probation was erroneously used as a tool for cautioning students as to their "borderline" success in the personal interview. To correct this the decision-making process of acceptance was revised, effective immediately, so that: a) interviewees who meet the required grades can be either accepted or rejected following their interview. b) only interviewees that do not meet the required grades can be accepted on probation following their interview. We will continue to monitor the rate of acceptance on probation.	2022-2023
2. Departmental mechanisms to inform students and involve them	The department is reinstating the student-faculty liaison committee, headed by Dr. Hagar Lahav. The committee will include two elected student representatives from each academic year, a teaching assistant, and the administrative student coordinator. The committee will meet four times a year and its minutes will be published to all students and faculty. This will improve students' knowledge of how their feedback is addressed and implemented whenever necessary.	2022-2023

These include <i>Introduction to Social</i> <i>Metaverse Activities, Digital Methodologies, The</i> <i>Innovation Lab: Digital Communities and the Third</i> <i>Sector.</i> Additional courses will be considered for the coming years.	2021-2024
 Providing remote access to key software programs 	The students mainly use Adobe software. During the COVID-19 Pandemic, remote access was provided by Adobe's generous academic open access. We agree with the recommendation for supplying remote access to key software programs routinely and will request a budget for this.	Depending on College budgets

Recognizing Hebrew- language publications of the faculty	Sapir College recognizes Hebrew-language publications of its entire faculty yet considers these as having lesser value than English-language ones.
